SIECE POSTER FORUM – CALL FOR POSTERS

As a part of the Screen Industries in East-Central Europe Conference (SIECE) 2012 a **Poster Forum** will be held, providing an opportunity for scholars to discuss their ongoing research into audiovisual culture and East-Central Europe.

Research projects may focus on any topic related to East-Central European screen industries, including Film Studies, Media Studies, and Screen Industry Studies.

Widely used in the sciences, posters enable humanities scholars to re-envisage their research in visual terms. Posters offer an opportunity to present and demonstrate work-in progress, to obtain feedback in an informal environment, and expose delegates to the preliminary findings of innovative on-going research. Posters also address a broad audience, permit the highlighting of the multi-disciplinary nature of work, facilitate exchanges among researchers, and enable the development of international collaborations. Visualize your research in order to communicate it simply, efficiently, and clearly.

Contributors are expected to be present at the venue during the poster forum. The forum itself will be informal, with no chairpersons assigned. It will take place during one of the receptions, at a time that will be confirmed in the Final Conference Program.

Posters should be unfussy in terms of composition and be readable by more than one person at any one time. Font size must be at least 6mm. Ideal poster size is A1 (ISO 216; 594 x 841 mm).

Posters should be submitted by **15 October 2012**.

Technical requirements: colour space sRGB (RGB), 8 bits colour depth, appropriate poster size (A1), JPEG/ TIFF format.

The **Forum Team** will arrange for the printing of posters and will cover all related costs.

Provision for multi-media presentations will **not** be available at the venue.

Confirmation of acceptance will be issued by **31 August 2012**.

SIECE Conference is sponsored by the Czech Society of Film Studies and Masaryk University in collaboration with MINE – Media Industries Network Europe.

Conference attendance is free of charge, and the conference will be conducted in the English language.
